



Acceptable Use Policy

This Acceptable Use Policy (AUP) describes prohibited uses of CloudWave Services. The examples described in this AUP are not exhaustive. Abuse or misuse of the Services may result in suspension or termination of the Services. We reserve the right, but do not assume the obligation, to investigate any violation of this AUP or misuse of the Services.

No Illegal, Infringing, Harmful, or High-Risk Activity

- **Illegal:** Any activities that are illegal under local, state, federal or international law while using CloudWave-owned resources.
- **Infringing:** Violations of the rights of any person or company protected by copyright, trade secret, patent or other intellectual property, or similar laws or regulations, including, but not limited to, the installation or distribution of "pirated", unapproved software applications.
- **Harmful:** Introduction of destructive or malicious programs into networks, servers or any other CloudWave device or environment (e.g., viruses, worms, Trojan horses, e-mail bombs, etc.).
- **High Risk:** Inappropriate use of CloudWave computing assets to transmit, retrieve or store materials for gambling, pornography, pyramid schemes, or any other abusive activity.

No Security Violations, Network Interference or Unauthorized Probing

- **Security Violations:** Unauthorized access, use or modification of a network or computing system to seek vulnerabilities within CloudWave systems or any other system.
- **Network Interference:** Unauthorized connection to any user, host or network for prohibited activities, including Denial of Service (DoS) attacks, system overloading, intentional system interference, and manual or electronic methods to restrict system access and storage.
- **Unauthorized Probing:** Unauthorized access to or use of data, systems or networks, including any attempt to probe, scan or test the vulnerability of a system or network or to breach security or authentication measures without express authorization of CloudWave or the owner of a system or network.

No Communication System Abuse

Communication System Abuse: Distributing, publishing, or facilitating unsolicited mass email or other communications to promote, advertise or solicit. Additionally, no impersonating anyone or any organization through the use of altering mail headers or other methods without the sender's permission.
